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PLAYWISE SUPPORT PASSPORT GUIDELINES:

The PlayWise Support Passport is a document designed to support young people, professionals, service providers and family members working with a child/ young person with Special Educational Needs & Disability (SEND) aged 0-18 years, to help understand their needs.

This document can be used through education and into school, for holiday and leisure activities, health appointments and other support services.

A support passport tells the people and services working with a child or young person about a persons' support needs, health conditions and needs, their learning disability, how they like to communicate and how to make things easier for them.

You can carry your support passport and show it to healthcare staff at the hospital, education & teaching staff at school and staff in leisure provisions.

It can help you to get the understanding, care and support you need in an easier to explain and visual way.

Support passports can get lost so it's a good idea to have more than one copy. You can print off several copies or download, save and email a digital copy.

The support passport can be updated whenever there is a change and when information needs to be amended.

This document can be shared with the people that are important in your child/ young person's care, learning and life. This can include GP's, paediatricians, therapists, play workers, teachers, education teams, teaching assistants, short break coordinators, social workers and extended family members etc.
